Coming Up

Nursery in our final half term this year we will be going on a 'magical train journey' discovering different lands such as underwater world, space, magical woods and land of cake.

Reception topic for the next half term is 'Growing'. We will be finding out about life cycles as well as growing our own plants. We will be finishing off our Level 3 phonics learning and then moving up to Level 4 phonics. In Maths we will be working on knowing our number bonds to 10 and counting to 20 off by heart

Year 1 have an exciting trip to Martin Mere planned, where we will look at different birds in their habitats! In Maths, we will move onto money and time. In English, we will be reading 'One Day on our Blue Planet in the Savannah', where we will continue to explore different habitats. In History, we will be looking at the lives and work of Beatrix Potter and Benjamin Zephaniah.

Year 2 will be continuing on the same Science and Geography topic as this term: Habitats and Africa. Keep an eye out for a final learning log which will be sent soon.

Year 3 will be reading the book Leon and the Place Between and in Maths we are looking at Time, Properties of Shapes, Mass and Capacity. Our topic work in the afternoon is Geography based and we are looking at European neighbours. Mr Brown will be taking the children for Athletics on a Wednesday afternoon. We are also looking forward to our trip to Hardcastle Crags.

Year 4 will be continuing to learn about time in Maths, moving on to statistics and co-ordinates later on. Our English will see us reading "The Great Kapok Tree" by L. Cherry which forms the link between all of our units: Brazil and the Amazon Rainforest.

Year 5 we will be learning how to convert units in Maths and exploring a picture book called 'Tuesday' in English which will provide us with plenty of writing

Year 6 in English, we will begin researching our own lives and writing autobiographies. In Maths, we will finish our statistics unit and will begin to look at transition work ready for secondary school. In Geography, we will start our Sustainable Futures topic which looks at our planet and how to look after it.
