- Remember, it is illegal to let off fireworks after 11.00pm on any date except 5 November which is extended to midnight.
- Never use petrol, paraffin or other flammable liquids and never put used fireworks, aerosols, foam-filled furniture, batteries, tins of paint or tyres on a bonfire

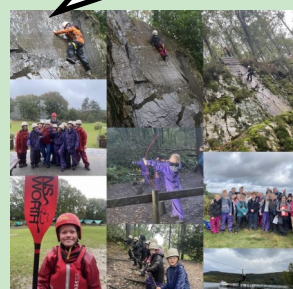
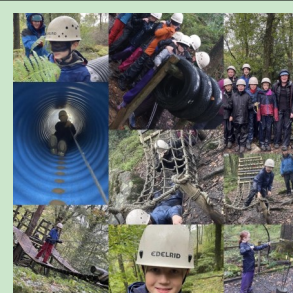

Nursery and Reception News

Nursery have been learning all about our families and people who help us. We've been playing firefighters, doctors and police (solving a Humpty Dumpty who-did-it; looking for clues, dusting for prints, counting our fingerprints and concluding the dinosaur did it possibly by accident). We've been playing bakers too, from pretend play cooking, to Goldilocks' porridge, making our own pasta and baking our own buns to use along with the 5 currant buns song. We've also been exploring Autumn, listening out for sounds outside, counting conkers, doing leaf rubbings and prints, reading Autumn stories (like the Leaf Thief) and so much more!



This half term has flown by in **Reception**; everyone settled into their new class and we started the year with a Traditional Tales topic. The children produced lots of lovely paintings of three pigs and three bears as well as doing some super story telling with our small world puppets. The whole class has been working incredibly hard during our phonics lessons as they follow the adventures of Kit and Sam in the Twinkl Phonics scheme. In maths we have been learning about counting rules through Numberblocks inspired maths lessons. We have finished this half term with lots of pumpkin inspired fun - from reading Pumpkin Soup to drawing pumpkins and then following a recipe to make pumpkin soup all by ourselves!



Reflections from KS1

Lots of fun has been had in **Year One** this first Autumn Term! In English, we have loved reading 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' and learning all about brown bears. We have produced some wonderful fact files showcasing all our knowledge and even went on a bear hunt of our own! In Maths we have been looking at place value to ten and exploring the resources available to us to deepen our understanding. Our history topic on Toys has led to us to creating our very own puppets! **Year 2** have had a super start to the new term. In English we have been reading stories by the Author Emily Gravett,

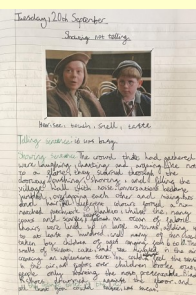

In maths we have done a unit on place value of numbers up to 100 and we have just started our addition and subtraction unit. In History, we have been learning all about the History of Todmorden Mill Town. We have compared our lives now to children's lives then and we went on a walk to discover important buildings that are still around today, although most have different uses.



Reflections from KS2

Year 6 have had an extremely busy yet exciting half-term! They have begun their study of World War 2 which has been linked to our English text 'Carrie's War'. The children have explored the causes of WW2, evacuation and rationing through a range of text-types and activities. In Maths, Year 6 have studied numbers to 10,000,000 and negative numbers whilst investigating factors, multiples and prime numbers. In Science, Year 6 have been making enquiries about light through a range of scientific investi-



gations. According to Year 6, the best part of this half-term has been our weeklong residential trip to Lakeside. The children showed resilience, perseverance and determination whilst supporting and caring for each other. They created memories to last a lifetime and we are all extremely proud of them. **Year 5** have had a fantastic start to the year. 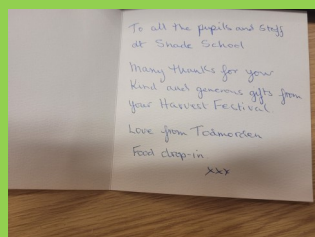


It has been an ex-

Year 4! We have worked
hard writing our own sto-

rating using expanded
noun phrases and conjunctions which have
been the focus of our grammar work. In
Maths, we have extended our knowledge of
place value to include 4 digit numbers. We
have also learnt about rounding to the near-
est multiple of 10, 100 and 1,000. In Science,
we have learnt about the human digestive
system and how our bodies work to digest
the food we eat. During our History topic of
the Elizabethan Era we have discovered the
Tudor royal family and how Queen Elizabeth
ruled her country.



Coming Up

Nursery will be starting off all spooky with Hal-
loween, using our experiences in play, then
we'll be making the classroom sparkle with our
dazzling fireworks and gearing up for a jolly
Christmas in Shade Nursery!

Reception will be learning about how people in
our local community and around the World
celebrate special times in their lives through
our Festivals and Celebrations topic. If you have
a special celebration coming up please let us
know! In phonics we will continue to learn the
initial letter sounds and the first set of tricky
words. In maths we will be consolidating our
knowledge of how numbers work within 5 with
a focus on knowing the number bonds off by
heart.

Year 1 will be learning addition and subtraction
before moving on to shape. In English, we will
be exploring 'Look Up!' and a very special
Christmas story! We have worked really hard
on forming simple sentences, ensuring we use
capital letters, finger spaces and full stops- we
know a great chant for this- and will continue
to embed this after half-term. We will start our
first Geography topic which is all about our
school and begin preparations for our Christ-
mas show!

Year 2 Next term we will be reading 10 things I
can do to help my world in English and finishing
off addition and subtraction in maths. We will
also be looking at the Geography of Todmor-
den in the afternoons. There is also a trip to
look forward to!

Year 3 will be starting a new book for English
next term, it is Iron Man by Ted Hughes. In
Maths we will continue to learn how to add and
subtract using exchanges later in the term. In
Science we will be looking at Rocks and how
they are formed and their properties. The Topic
of Romans is following the Stone Age for Histo-
ry. A topic they all love. We have PE on a Tues-
day with Mr Brown.

Year 4 will move onto addition and subtraction
in Maths. We will be reading "Varjak Paw" as
the basis for our English wok and our Science
topic will be States of Matter.

Year 5 will be continuing our study of the Victo-
rians which fits in well with our new class Eng-
lish book: Street Child. In maths, we are looking
forward to exploring multiplication, division and
fractions!

Year 6 are continuing with our study of WW2
exploring the concept of 'Make Do and Mend'
which will be supported by our new art topic of
graphic design. This also links to our class trip to
Danelaw Centre for Living History on Thursday
1st December. In English, we are going to start
reading our new class text 'Wonder' which ex-
plores a tough, sweet, 10-year-old boy, who
was born with distorted facial features. In
Maths, we are going to be starting our fractions
topic.
