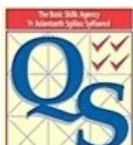
Hello everyone,

Nursery and Reception News

Nursery have had a great half term exploring all sorts. We have been on a magical train journey, creating maps and looking at where we live. We looked at the world of dance and tried different styles such as rhythmic gymnastics, West African dance styles and morris dancing. We have looked at different dinosaurs in Tyrannosaurus Drip and explored using different materials in our art and most recently we have been exploring robots, from those in 'No-bot, The Robot With No Bottom' to the Curiosity rover on Mars, amazing vacuum cleaners and even prosthetic arms! Some of us have started to look at letter sounds, s,a,t,p and we have all continued to explore numbers, shapes and repeating patterns. We loved our visit to our new forest school area and have had a great time cooking pancakes, fruit kebabs biscuits and robot toast.



This half term has been all about growth and change in **Reception**. We grew cress, which we harvested and made into delicious wraps for a snack. We looked at the parts of plants and made some super observational drawings of spring flowers. We even attempted to grow mushrooms - we carefully followed all of the instructions but nothing happened! We enjoyed getting out in the spring sunshine and helping plant seeds on the forest school site - we can't wait to see all the different types of wildflowers and grasses as they grow. We finished off the term learning about Easter and how Christians around the World celebrate this special festival.



Reflections from KS1

Year 2 have been reading The Dark by Lemnony Snickett in English. We were all relieved that it had a happy ending. We have been perfecting our diary and letter writing skills. In Maths, we have been looking at reading scales for weight, measure and capacity as well as solving problems involving units of measurement. In Geography, we have been learning about similarities and differences between hot and cold countries, we have finished the term off by writing a



fact file about Svalbard, the Northern most habitable place on Earth. In computing we have been

learning how to research using the internet and search engines. We've had an incredibly busy six weeks in **Year One**! This half-term we were inspired by James Carter to write our own poetry and have also really enjoyed reading 'The Bog Baby'. In Maths we have looked at place value to 20, addition and subtraction within 20 as well as place value to 50. We will continue with weight and measure after the Easter Holidays, before tackling multiplication and division, fractions, place value within 100, time and money! We're loving our castles topic in History and can't wait for our trip to Skip-ton castle next half-term! We've made yummy- albeit a little salty- ice-cream in science and have learnt lots of new greetings in French.

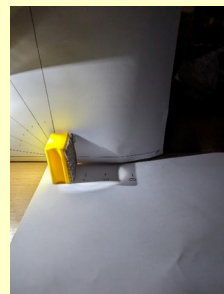
Reflections from KS2

topic in Geography and Science! Another
busy term ahead!

Year 2 will start the term by looking at our
learning logs! In English, we will be reading
Amazing Grace By Mary Hoffman alongside
learning all about Kenya and Nairobi in
Geography. In science we will be looking
at materials and their properties and in
maths we will be looking at fractions and
telling the time. Next term is also our Par-
ents in School

Year 3 are reading a book called Storm
about a little girl and the ghost of a horse
rider killed by highwaymen. In Maths we
will be moving onto Fractions again and
Money. Science is about Animals Including
Humans, where we identify animals and
look at what they eat and their skeletal
system. In History we are studying the Sax-
ons and Vikings.

Year 4 will move onto decimals and money
in Maths. We will be reading "The Fire-
work Maker's Daughter" as the basis for
our English work and our Science topic will
be Living Things and Their Habitats. We
will also be delving into the Ancient Mayan
world in History.

Year 5 will be exploring the Ancient Greeks
in history and English with this term's class
book, The Adventures of Odysseus. In
maths, we will be moving onto geometry
as we begin to look at shape, as well as
position and direction.

Year 6 will begin our transition to high
school by taking part in 'shuffle-up' days at
our new schools. Whilst this new and ex-
citing transition begins, we will continue to
work hard in Year 6 in order to grow as
mature and confident Shade pupils. Our
new topic study will be sustainable fea-
tures where we will understand how to
sustain our world.
